In conjunction with RFATS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) will hold a public meeting for the purposes of receiving input on the transportation planning process for the RFATS Study Area. The Rock Hill-Fort Mill Area Transportation Study (RFATS), is the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for coordinating the transportation planning process for the York County Urbanized Area. The membership of RFATS includes the Town of Fort Mill, the cities of Rock Hill and Tega Cay, the Catawba Indian Nation as well as the eastern urbanized portion of York County.

This public meeting is being held as a part of a review that is conducted every four years to ensure compliance with all federal transportation planning regulations for metropolitan areas. The focus of the review is not only on RFATS compliance with federal regulations, but also to assess the public's awareness of the local transportation planning process. A federal review team will be in attendance and is seeking public input on the current transportation planning process and ways to make improvements to the existing process.
