Participate In Rock Hill Spruce Up For Spring

- March 5 – March 29 is Spruce up for Spring!
- During this time, sanitation workers will collect extra yard waste and bulky trash at curbside. These items must be separated for collection. Yard waste, bulky items (such as furniture or other trash) and metal must be in separate piles. Metal and appliances will be picked up on a work order basis. Call **803/329-5600** if you have metal or appliances for pick-up. Crews will also remove old roll carts, whether full or empty.
- The City will provide a 4-yard dumpster to help your neighborhood association with large quantities of trash. The Dial-A-Dumpster Service (a \$90 value) will be free of charge until March 29. Dumpsters will be available to neighborhoods for one week. To reserve your dumpster, call Mike Kropp at Neighborhood Empowerment at **803/325-2523**.

The following items **WILL NOT BE COLLECTED** at curbside or in dumpsters: Bricks, stumps, tires, toilets, car parts, water heaters, sheet rock, concrete blocks, wood, carpet, remodeling or construction debris. Latex paint, used motor oil, oil filters and car batteries can be taken to the York County Landfill. For landfill questions call: **803/628-3181**.

Youth Service Day

Nationally, Youth Service Day is the largest service event of its kind. This year, millions of youth will participate in the 18th Annual National Youth Service Day. This event provides young people the opportunity to design and lead service-learning projects in areas ranging from literacy and the environment, to healthcare, hunger and helping the elderly.

Locally, the Rock Hill Youth Service Day is sponsored by the Rock Hill Youth Council. The Rock Hill Youth Council provides high school students of Rock Hill with an active role in addressing youth-related issues. These volunteer representatives are selected to reach out to their fellow teens and inform them about existing opportunities and suggest what the City of Rock Hill can do to improve its youth-oriented efforts.

Youth Service Day 2007 will be held Saturday, March 24, from noon until 4 p.m. School clubs, church youth groups, scouts or any group of teens interested in taking an afternoon to make a difference in the community are invited to take part.

All volunteer teams will gather at Cherry Park's enclosed shelter at noon for a kick-off celebration featuring food, prizes, music and free T-shirts. Volunteers will then travel to their project location



to begin work. Groups are responsible for organizing their own service project. In the past, service groups have picked up roadside litter, set up clothing closets, organized activities for the mentally disabled and fed those in need.

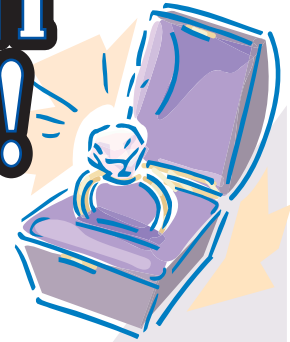
