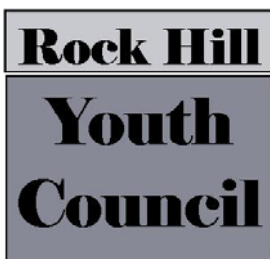

Rock Hill Youth Service Day Possible Volunteer Ideas March 27, 2010

List below are a few ideas to get your group thinking. Please make contact with the agency to get specific details and confirm their needs.

- Adopt a highway or a park
- Make care packages for children who stay at different shelters in the area Children's Attention Home, Safe Passage, Pilgrim's Inn (clothes, books)
- Call one of the many nursing homes (sing, play games, paint nails)
- Call the United Way to see if one of their agencies needs help (paint a room, organizes donations, yard clean up)
- Deliver care packages to the hospital
- Lead a workshop or tutor local children
- Hold a fund raiser for a local agency such as the American Red Cross
- Collect can goods for St Mary's Soup Kitchen, Hope Inc. or Pilgrim's Inn pantry
- Plan a fun day for children who have special needs
- Adopt a senior citizen who needs some work around their home
- Clean an outside areas around a school, church or a vacant lot
- Collect needed supplies for one of the animal adoption organizations
- Collect household goods for those who have been homeless and starting over – Interfaith Hospitality Network or Pilgrim's Inn
