1. Call to Order
2. Approval of Minutes of February Meeting: Will need to approve in May, didn't have a quorum.
3. Board and Subcommittee Goals Review:
 - Subcommittees did not meet, but reported litter at Shirley/Riverchase and Anderson/Cherry, cookout trash can at bus stop is overflowing. Red River by shopping area is bad. Will try to schedule a cleanup at our May meeting.
 - Litter and Beautification: Working to meet with HOAs or Neighborhood Associations in Wards 5 and 2 in January or February to talk litter prevention and recycling. Ryan will get Gary an updated list of HOAs. Met with Catawba Terrace HOA, only 3 attendees. Will look for a meeting to attend in Ward 5. Possible spring cleanup in Ward 5. Coordinate with Jason Weil to contact Clean and Green.
 - Recycling: Discussing how to convey the message that you already pay for recycling, so you should get a recycling bin. How do we have these conversations with new residents. What can we do at upcoming events. Put QR codes on outreach materials. Information on City website front page and in utility bills.
 - Education: Came up with ChristmasVille activity ideas. We have several ideas to include some education component to our participation. The craft was fine, but we felt that those participating did not make the connection between the craft and C&G. Here is a list of ideas we brainstormed last night. We can still do a craft but may it does not become the main focus of our table.
 - Recycling sorts or some other activity
 - Have a video streaming that folks can watch will kids are making craft. Maybe the video could be the YC MRF?
 - Have examples of alternative options for gift wrapping. For example, using canvas gift bags. We might also have examples of items that cannot be recycled

(foil and plastic wrapping paper, etc.) and the alternatives people could use, including wrapping paper made of recycled content.

- We were also thinking we could provide the participants with reusable bags to use while shopping during the event. This could be communicated to vendors and possibly even ask vendors not to use plastic bags.
- Have a wrapping table so that folks could wrap items they purchase during the events with 'sustainable' wrapping paper.
- Participate at Chalk on Main, come up with ideas for Earth Day Birthday.: Elizabeth did not hear back from Come See Me team leader.

Create a mini "Follow the Bottle" lesson to use with the two or three at a time who visit our table- include tubes of plastic shred, fibers ready to weave into carpet or cloth, a toy recycling truck, etc - Pass examples from child to adult during discussion time.

- Bring back Litter Fishing or a litter/recycle sort to play with on the ground outside our tent. We would like for children to sort the items we bring into trash or recycle bins.
- Bring a picture frame/photo prop painted with words that encourages guests to recycle or the RH Clean and Green logo- Once posted on social media, others will see the message.
- Bring bottle caps and frames to make mosaics. Adults will take pictures once mosaics are made and children will return the caps to our booth for others to reuse the materials. Clean and Green volunteers will discuss recycling with the adults while children play with the caps to make art.
